### Baranenko

Complex genealogical research

**Source data:** Baranenko Ivan Oleksandrovych was born in 1906 in the village of Stariy Kovray, Irkliiv Volost, Zolotonisky District, Poltava Province. His parents' names were Oleksandr (unknown middle name) and Nataliya Kyrylivna.

It is known that Ivan Oleksandrovych had three sisters: Anna, born in 1893, Varvara, born in 1898, and Maria, born in 1909.

The purpose of the research: search and processing of primary and secondary genealogical sources in the State Archive of the Cherkasy Region (DACHeO), the State Archive of the Poltava Region (DAPO), the Central State Historical Archive of the City of Kyiv (CDIAK) and the Russian State Historical Archive in the city of St. Petersburg (RDIA); search for preserved information on the Baranenko family.

**Chronological limits of the research:** 1850 – 1919.

## 1. Brief description of the research process

Before starting archival work, we conducted an **analysis of the preservation** of primary and secondary genealogical sources relating to the village of Stary Kovrai, Irkliiv Volost, Zolotonisky District (*see items 3, 4, 5, 6*).

It was found out that there was a parish Orthodox church of the Nativity of the Virgin in the village of Stariy Kovray. **The parish register**, of this parish were preserved from 1870 to 1919<sup>1</sup> and are in the State Archive of the Cherkasy Region (DACHeO). Earlier parish register, as well as **confessional notorieties**, could not be found, from which it was concluded that they have not been preserved to our time.

Next, it was found out that the **revision lists**, which are also in the DACHeO, have been preserved. Mainly, the materials of the tenth revision of 1858 in the Zolotonisky District have been preserved, but, as it turned out later, the village of Stariy Kovray was not included in these documents – the revision lists of it were not preserved.

We also checked separate open genealogical databases in order to identify the bearers of the surname Baranenko, natives of the village of Stariy Kovray. The result was positive, which once again confirmed the fact that the family originated from this settlement (*see item 2*).

We started the archival work with the processing of parish register, in which records related to the studied family were found. From Ivan Oleksandrovyh Baranenko, it was possible to advance several generations deeper - to his great-grandfather Serhiy, who was born at the beginning of the 19th century (*see item 7*). The next step was to work with revision lists, but the result turned out to be negative - the materials were incomplete.

Next, we reviewed the charter of the inhabitants of the village of Stariy Kovray in the St. Petersburg Regional State Administration, where we found a list of householders from 1861, among which was the representative of the family we were investigating, Maksym Serhiyiv Baranenko, born in 1832.

After that, we completed the work with the main genealogical sources for the village of Stariy Kovray, it was impossible to go deeper than the available data, and also to find more detailed biographical information about the members of the Baranenko family.

But already during the processing of archival materials and writing a short essay on the history of the village of Stariy Kovrai, we paid attention to one detail. In the "Lists of populated places of the Poltava province for 1859" there was no village Stary Kovrai. Only a certain settlement of Kovrai was mentioned. Later, in the "Information on landowners' lands of 1860" the settlement of Kovrai was also mentioned, but it was additionally indicated that it belonged to the landowner Anisia Kostyantynivna Dubrovinia, due to which it was concluded that the village was previously called simply Kovrai, and was a settlement, that is, it did not have of the parish Orthodox church. Therefore, a new task was to find out the parish to which the settlement belonged before 1870.

In the "Compendium of Information on the Revenues of the Poltava Province for 1895" the village of Stary Kovrai was named in parentheses as Troitske. Therefore, we assumed that this could be the second name of the village and processed the parish register of the Trinity Orthodox Church in the town of Irkliiv, to which the settlement of Troitske once belonged. We hoped that by 1870, Stariy Kovray under the name of the Troitske settlement was a part of the Irkliiv Troitske Parish. The metric books for the years 1847-1859 were reviewed and many families with the surname Baran, residents of the Troitskyi settlement, were found, but the searched names were not there. The metric books of two more parishes of the town of Irkliiv, Mykolaiivska and Uspenska, were also checked, but no bearers of the surname Baran, same as the village of Stariy Kovray, were found there.

Later it turned out that the Troitske settlement is not the village of Stariy Kovrai. Troitske is the village of Noviy Kovray, which was settled by families from Stary Kovray, which is why identical surnames are found there. In addition, in the "Information on landlord lands of 1860" Troitske was listed separately from the village of Kovrai, and there it was stated that it belonged to the landowner Fotina Pavlivna Trebinska, not Dubrovinia.

After that, we continued the search for a hypothetical parish in another direction. According to the "Map of Strilbytskyi for 1871", we discovered that near the village of Stariy Kovray there was a village of Lykholity, which had an Orthodox parish, after which we decided to check its parish register. The result this time turned out to be positive: Stariy Kovray, as a Kovray settlement, really belonged to the Lykholit Peter and Paul Parish at one time, and representatives of the family we were researching were found in the parish register.

Thanks to the processing of the parish register of the Peter and Paul Church for the years 1847-1870, it was possible to find more detailed biographical information from different generations of the researched family, as well as to advance one generation deeper than the situation that existed before.

After processing the parish register, a confessional notoriety of the parish of the Peter and Paul Church in the State Archive of the Poltava Region for the year 1859 was also discovered, but working with it in the reading room of the archive was not available at the time of the research.

After the archival work was completed, a report was drawn up on the conducted searches, as well as the prospects for further searches were assessed. In addition, the genealogical chart of the studied family was written, and a genealogical tree was formed.

## 2. Work with open sources and databases

We studied seven open Internet resources that contain genealogical information. The purpose of the work: the presence of the bearers of the surname Boronenko (Baranenko) from the village of Stary Kovray. The result of the work was presented in the form of a table.

## 8. Conclusions and prospects for further research

### Conclusions:

- 1) It was possible to find and process key genealogical sources for the village of Stariy Kovray, Zolotonisky district for 1919-1847, to restore the history of the Baranenko family to the beginning of the 19th century.

### Prospects for further research:

- 1) Genealogical sources for the years 1847-1734 can be processed in order to deepen the information on the Baranenko family pedigree.
- 2) We can find and process the registers of the Register of Civil Registry Office for the 1920s and 1930s in order to find records of the death of Oleksandr Petrovych and Natalia Artemivna Baranenko.
- 3) It is possible to work out the confessional notorieties of the village of Lykholity for 1859 in order to establish the exact composition of the family in this period.
- 4) We can view other secondary genealogical sources found by us for the Zolotonsky district of the Poltava province in order to expand biographical information about representatives of various generations of the Baranenko family in the 19th - early 20th centuries.

### **A brief history of the village of Stariy Kovray**

**(XVIII – beginning of XX century)**

According to oral and documentary sources, the Baranenko family originates from the village of Stariy Kovray, Irkliiv Volost, Zolotonisky District, Poltava Province<sup>8</sup>.

The village of Stariy Kovray spread along both banks of the Kovray river, a tributary of the Dnipro river. The name of the settlement comes from the river<sup>9</sup>.

It is not known when and by whom the village of Stariy Kovray was founded. The first documentary references to the village date back to 1767 and are found in the "General Register of the Left Bank of Ukraine". At that time, the settlement belonged to the Irkliiv sotnia of the Pereyaslav Regiment [13].

At first, the village was simply called Kovray. The prefix "Stary" appeared closer to the middle of the 19th century to distinguish this settlement from the neighboring Novy Kovray (another name Troitske), which was settled by families from Stariy Kovray.

In 1782, after the liquidation of the regimental system of Left-Bank Ukraine, the village of Stariy Kovray became part of the Zolotonisky District of the Kyiv Province, and in 1802 it became part of the Irkliiv Volost of the Zolotonisky District of the Poltava Province. [10].

Stariy Kovray was a landowner's village inhabited by peasants [1, 38] [11, 10-11]. It is known that in the 1840s the settlement was divided between several owners: the widow Maria Mykhailivna Trebinska, Nadia Kostyantynivna Mering, the wife of the collegiate assessor Gustav Fedorovych Mering, and Anisia Kostyantynivna Lange, the wife of the colonel<sup>10</sup>.

According to archival materials, since 1856, the entire village belongs to Anisia Kostyantynivna Lange (Dubrovina by second husband)<sup>11</sup> [14].

In 1861, Emperor Alexander II carried out an agrarian reform: the peasants of the village of Stariy Kovray were freed from serfdom and received land plots - homesteads and fields - for which they had to pay annual rent to the landlady Dubrovina. Until the full repayment of the redemption amount, the peasants were considered temporarily obligated.

As of 1861, in the village of Stariy Kovray there were 141 yards and 375 male serfs, among whom 46 dessiatins of homestead land and 347 dessiatins of field land were divided [11, 10-11].

According to archival sources, most of the villagers managed to pay the redemption amount at the beginning of the 1880s, becoming peasants-owners.

Initially, the village of Stariy Kovray belonged to the Orthodox parish in the neighboring village of Lykholity [14]. Around 1870, an Orthodox church in the name of the Nativity of the Virgin was built in Stariy Kovray and a separate parish was founded. In 1892, the temple was rebuilt and improved, in particular, the bell tower was completed<sup>12</sup>. It is known that there was a parish school by the church [8, 372].

At the beginning of the 20th century, there were 162 households and 1,213 residents of both sexes in the village of Stariy Kovray [12, 208-209].

The earliest documented representative of the researched family at this stage of the research is the peasant **Serhii Afanasyev Baran**. He appears in the parish register of the Peter and Paul Orthodox Church of the village of Lykholity between 1847 and 1861. Serhii Afanasyev was born in 1805. The probable place of his birth is the village of Stariy Kovray, Zolotonisky district, Poltava province.

In addition to Serhii Afanasyev and his sons, **Anton Mykhaylov Baranenko** is also mentioned in the archival sources, but his family ties with the studied family have not been discovered at the moment [1, 39-40].

At the current stage of research, the earliest ancestor on the Baranenko line is named **Afanasiy**. Apart from his name and the fact that he had a son Serhii, nothing else is known about him. Revision lists about the village of Stariy Kovray from 1858 and 1850, which could contain information about Afanasiy Baranenko, have not been preserved to our time<sup>14</sup>.

### 1. Serhii Afanasiyovych Baranenko

Serhii Afanasiyovych Baranenko was born in 1805 in a family of Orthodox peasants. The probable place of his birth was the village of Stariy Kovray, Zolotonisky district, Poltava province, which belongs to the Lange landowners<sup>15</sup>.

It is known that Serhii Baranenko's wife's name was Melania Fedorivna. The family had at least four sons: Maksym (born in 1832), Petro (born in 1836), Ananiy (year of birth unknown) and Ilya (born on July 19, 1848).

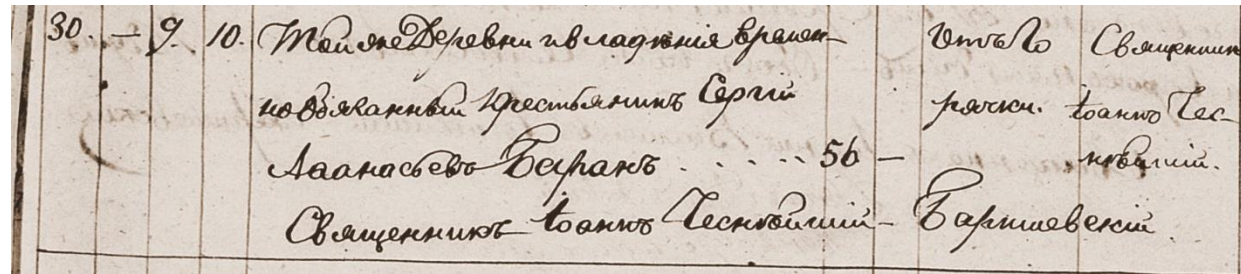
Serhii Afanasiyovych lived on land owned in the 1840s by the landowner Maria Mykhailivna Trebinska, and paid rent in kind for her benefit, or performed duties.

Serhii Baranenko died on October 9, 1861 at the age of 56 from fever. He was buried on the second day after his death by priest Ioann Chestneishiy in the village cemetery of Stariy Kovrai [14, 239]. It can be assumed that some time before his death Serhii Afanasiyovych was ill, because in the lists of householders, which were made shortly after the abolition of serfdom in February 1861, his eldest son Maksym is listed as the head of the family [1, 43-44].

Melania Fedorivna Baranenko outlived her husband by ten years and died after 1870<sup>16</sup>.

## 2.1. Petro Serhiyovych Baranenko

Petro Serhiyovych Baranenko was born in 1836 in the village of Stariy Kovray, Zolotonisky district, Poltava province, in a peasant family. He was baptized, most likely, in the Peter and Paul Orthodox Church in the nearby village of Lykholity.

It is known that Petro Serhiyovych had three brothers - Maksym, Ilya and Ananiy - who also lived in the village of Stariy Kovray.

Petro Serhiyovych was married twice. His first wife's name was Varvara Emelianivna, they got married in the mid-1850s<sup>17</sup>. The family had a son, Cornyliy<sup>18</sup> (1858 – 16.02.1918) and a daughter, Maria (03.07.1860 – 12.07.1860), who lived only twelve days and died because of catching a cold [14, 230]. Varvara Emelianivna died shortly after the death of her daughter, on August 14, 1860, from fever [14, 230b].

The second wife's name was Maria Mykytivna Kurgan, born in 1830<sup>19</sup>. The rite of their marriage took place in the Orthodox church of the village of Lykholity on November 3, 1860. The newlyweds were married by priest Ioann Chestneishiy [14, 158b].

Petro Serhiyovych had five children with Maria Mykytivna: Kyrylo (born on March 20, 1862), Oleksandr (probably born between 1863 and 1866), Marfa (born on June 10, 1867), Pelageya (born on October 7, 1868) and Lukyan (born 06.02.1871).

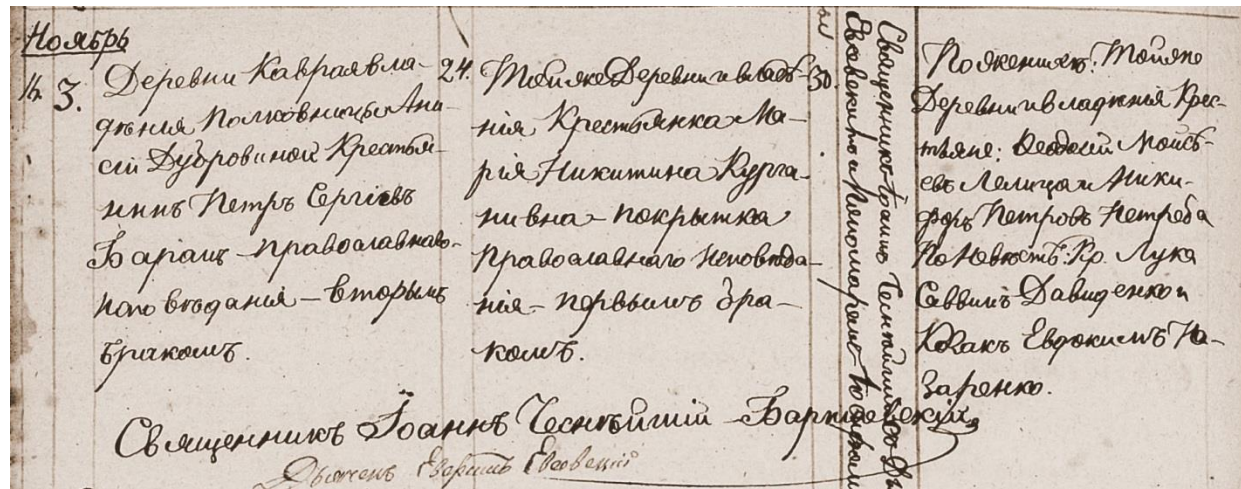

In the early 1860s, Petro Serhiyovych Baranenko, together with his family and younger brothers, lived in the same household with his older brother Maksym, who was listed as the head of the family in documentary sources [1].

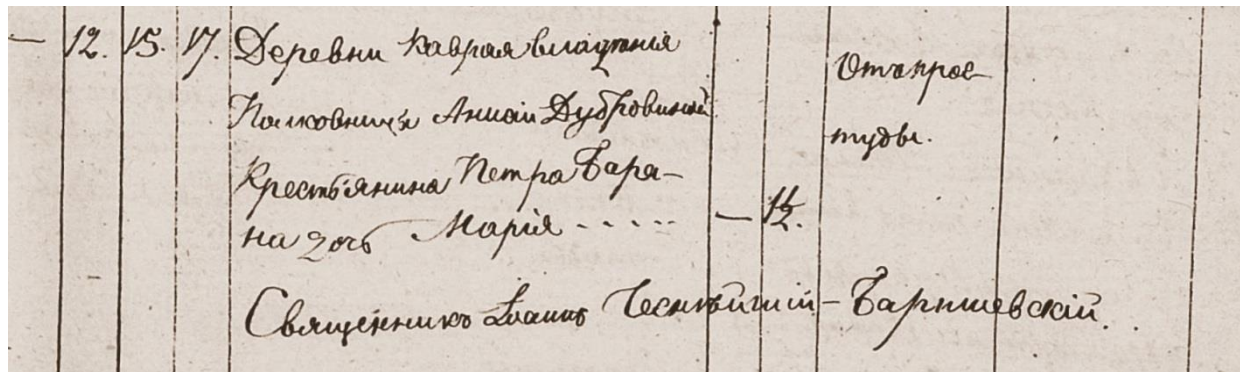


Parish register record of the marriage of Petro Serhiyovych Baran and Maria Mykytivna Kurgan, 1860

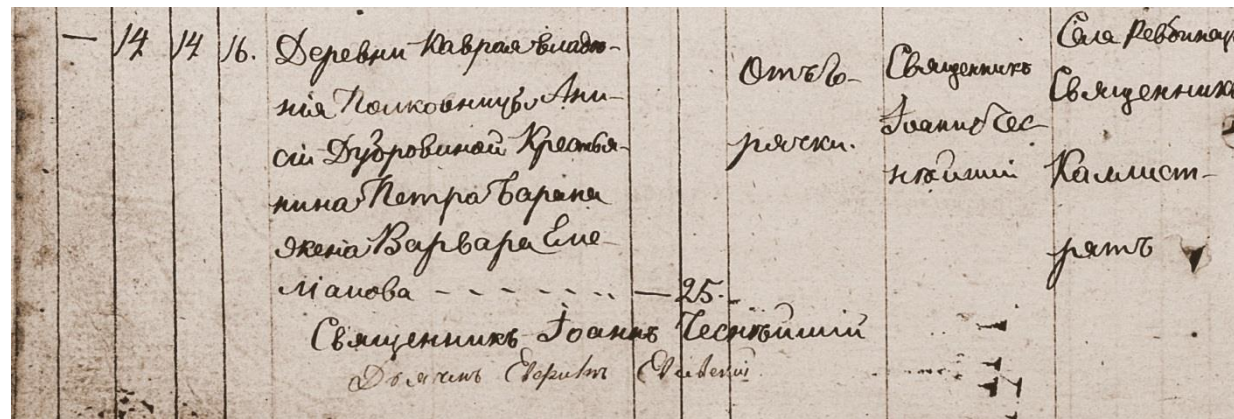
In 1861, after the agrarian reform and abolition of serfdom by Emperor Alexander II, a peasant meeting was held in the village of Stariy Kovray, in which the heads of the 141 families took part, including the elder brother of Petro Serhiyovych, Maksym. The representative of the landowner Anisia Kostyantynivna Dubrovina agreed to give the peasants 46 dessiatins of 907 sazhen of manor land and 347 dessiatins of 1,200 sazhen of field land to the peasants for redemption.

Baranenko family received for common use 804 sazhen of homestead land and 3 dessiatins of 1,200 sazhen of field land, as well as the right to use a public paddock for cattle grazing [1]. Until full repayment of the amount for land ownership, Petro Serhiyovych and his relatives belonged to the category of temporarily obligated peasants.

Petro Serhiyovych, like his ancestors, was engaged in agriculture all his life: he cultivated the land, harvested crops, and managed the household. After the agrarian reform and the abolition of serfdom, Petro Serhiyovych and his relatives managed to quickly buy land plots from the landowner Dubrovina: in archival documents from 1882, the studied family is listed as peasants-owners.

When and under what circumstances Petro Serhiyovych and Maria Mykytivna died is unknown due to the lack of parish registers. They were buried at the village cemetery in the village of Stariy Kovray.

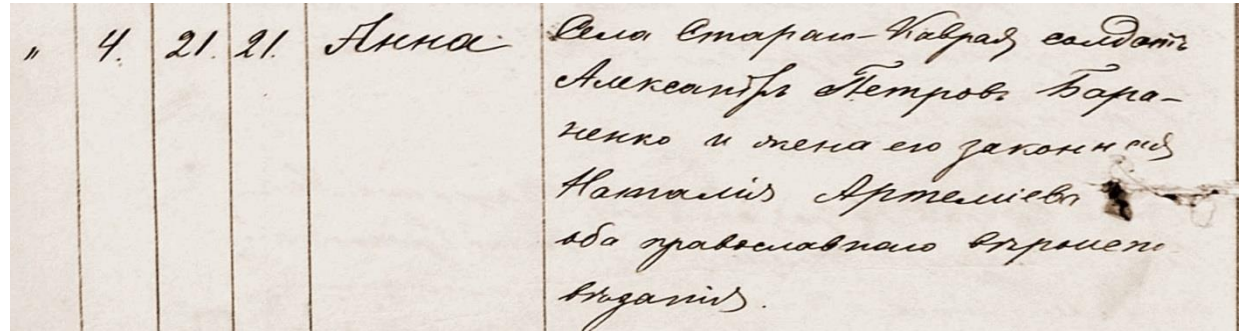
### 3.2. Oleksandr Petrovych Baranenko

Oleksandr Petrovych Baranenko was born between 1863 and 1866<sup>20</sup> in the village of Staryy Kovray, Zolotonіllн district, in a peasant family. The place where he was baptized is

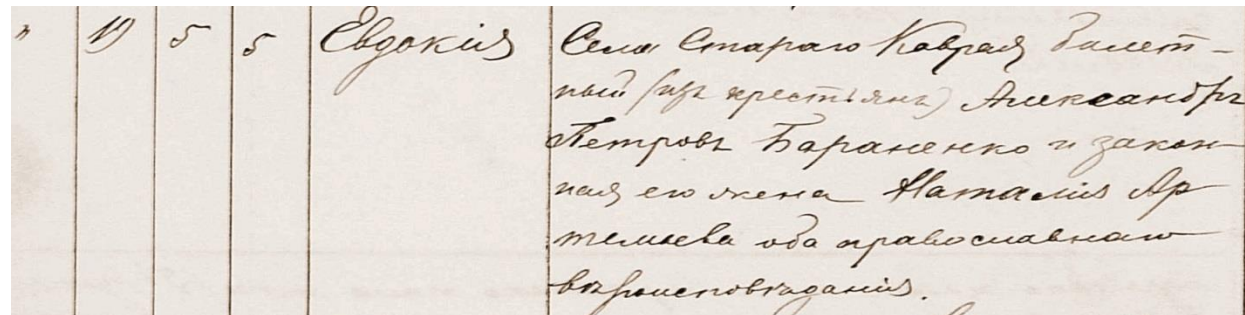

unknown. In addition to Oleksandr, the family had three more sons, Kyrylo, Cornyliy and Lukyan, and two daughters, Maria and Pelageya.

Around 1893, Oleksandr Petrovych married a woman named Natalia Artemivna (maiden surname unknown). There were six children in the marriage: Hanna (born on March 21, 1894), Evdokia (born on August 5, 1895), Semen (born on September 1, 1902), Varvara (born on December 1, 1903), Ivan (born on November 9, 1909).

It is known that Oleksandr Petrovych underwent urgent military service in the Russian Imperial Army, after which he was considered a reserve soldier of a lower rank.

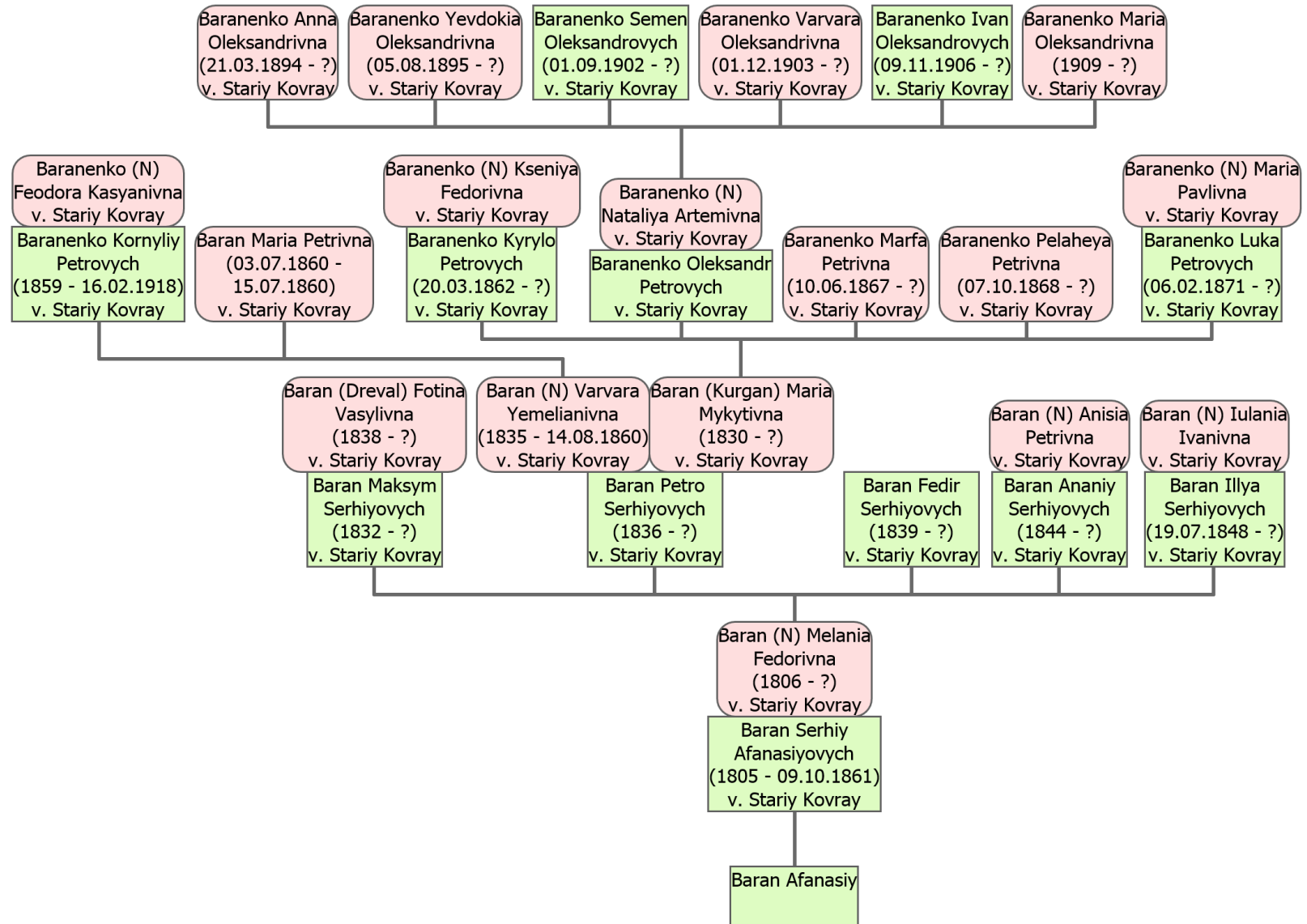
The dates and circumstances of the death of Oleksandr Petrovych and Natalia Artemivna are unknown at the moment of the research<sup>21</sup>.
